Annual Legislative Survey Results

Thank you for participating in the Annual Legislative Survey! We were encouraged by the number of responses and the positive feedback despite the most unusual circumstances caused by the pandemic.

As we considered the data, it became clear that safety within our schools is the most important issue for our members, with 92% of those responding either agreeing or strongly agreeing. Even though many schools throughout central lowa experienced a "snow day" recently, 87% agreed that their district was adequately prepared for future emergencies such as weather or pandemics. Substitute teachers are still in high demand with 90% stating there are shortages within their districts.

Districts worked tirelessly this past summer on technology issues and it shows! Seventy-seven percent said their district is equipped to handle the technology demands of virtual learning, and the Technology Specialists are successfully managing issues that arise.

Eighty-seven percent of our educators regard the IEP process for students as being successfully implemented within their districts.

The two greatest concerns our members have for their students are 1) the loss of learning and 2) the loss of peer relationships.
